FEE SCHEDULE

<u>Mediation and Non-Collective-Bargaining Adjudication</u>: Fees based on an hourly rate of \$400. Parties will be charged for all hours engaged in the following activities: mediation time; hearing time; non-administrative pre-mediation / pre-hearing activities; post-hearing record study and decision preparation; travel time. Parties will be charged actual cost of reasonable travel expenses (in addition to travel time) from Madison, Wisconsin as the point of origin, including air and train fares, car rental, mileage, lodging, meals.

<u>Cancellation Policy for Mediations</u>: Cancellation fee of three (3) hours for any mediation cancelled or postponed less than 7 business days prior to the scheduled session date.

<u>Cancellation Policy for Non-Collective-Bargaining Hearings</u>: Cancellation fee of \$3,200 for any hearing cancelled or postponed less than 14 days prior to scheduled hearing date.

<u>Collective Bargaining Grievance Arbitration, Interest Arbitration, Fact-Finding</u>: Fees based on an 8-hour per diem of \$1,600. For in-person proceedings, a full per diem will be charged for any used portion of a scheduled day. For video-conferenced proceedings, the parties will be charged a prorated portion of the per diem only for hours used. A prorated portion of the per diem will also be charged for the following activities: hearing time on hearing days exceeding 8 hours; non-administrative prehearing activity; record study and decision preparation; travel time. Parties will be charged actual cost of reasonable travel expenses (in addition to travel time) from Madison, Wisconsin as the point of origin, including air and train fares, car rental, mileage, lodging, meals.

<u>Cancellation Policy for Collective Bargaining Hearings</u>: Cancellation fee of 1 per diem for hearing cancelled or postponed less than 14 days prior to scheduled hearing date.
